ABOUT THE PROJECT

We have a situation! is a series of live, trans-border, online-offline participatory performances addressing current cross-cultural European issues. Four “situations” will be created in four countries - France, Netherlands, UK and Austria - with each “situation” involving a 4-day workshop and the performance addressing a particular matter of concern. For the London Situation the focus will be on electronic waste.

ABOUT THE LONDON SITUATION: WORKING WITH ELECTRONIC WASTE

Media artist Tom Keene (Furtherfield) has been setting up the “situation” for the arrival of Helen Varley Jamieson (*We Have a Situation!* lead artist) and the other project partners. Tom will work with Bright Sparks, a local recycling/fixing/making project, situated in the middle of a housing estate in Islington, not far from Furtherfield Gallery, on researching the social & economic relationship with material things and their consequent hasty obsolescence. Bright Sparks has been working with local people to re-use, repair and recycle electronics & furniture. The project will facilitate a lot of skills exchange & network-building and it will be a very inspiring experience for everyone involved.
